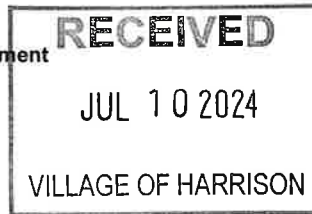

Subject: US 10 Project Notification and Request for Comments

Project ID 1500-49-30 (60, 61)
Appleton – Brillion, WIS 114 to County N
US 10, Calumet County

The Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) is in the process of developing plans to rehabilitate the pavement on approximately 4 miles of US 10 between WIS 114 and County N in Calumet County. The project is located in the city of Menasha and village of Harrison. Construction is currently scheduled for 2028 but could occur as early as 2026.

The purpose of this outreach is to obtain your feedback on the identified needs and proposed improvements. We appreciate your input and encourage you to take a moment to review the project information in this letter and provide comments.

We have developed a project website with detailed information on the proposed improvements and exhibits.

Project needs

- Deteriorating asphalt and concrete pavement and spot curb and gutter
- Curb ramps do not meet Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards
- Deteriorating and outdated guardrail
- Deteriorating drainage culverts
- Deteriorating asphalt pavement at the County N Park & Ride

Proposed improvements

- Repair and grind concrete pavement from WIS 114 to Fire Lane 7 to improve driving conditions
- Repair concrete pavement and place an asphalt overlay from Fire Lane 7 to County N
- Resurface all asphalt shoulders on US 10
- Replace spot sections of curb and gutter
- Upgrade curb ramps to meet ADA standards at County LP and Oneida Street, as required
- Replace guardrails to meet current standards
- Repair drainage features (cleaning culverts, replacing endwalls, minor ditch grading and one culvert replacement)
- Install new pavement marking and replace shoulder rumble strips to maintain safety
- Resurface the asphalt pavement at the County N Park & Ride
- All work is anticipated inside the existing right-of-way.

Traffic impacts

- Crews will manage traffic using single-lane closures with flaggers.
- Short-term detours will be required to accommodate the paving within the Oneida Street intersection and at the WIS 114 interchange ramps. Weekday closures are anticipated.
- The County N Park & Ride will be closed for up to one week.
